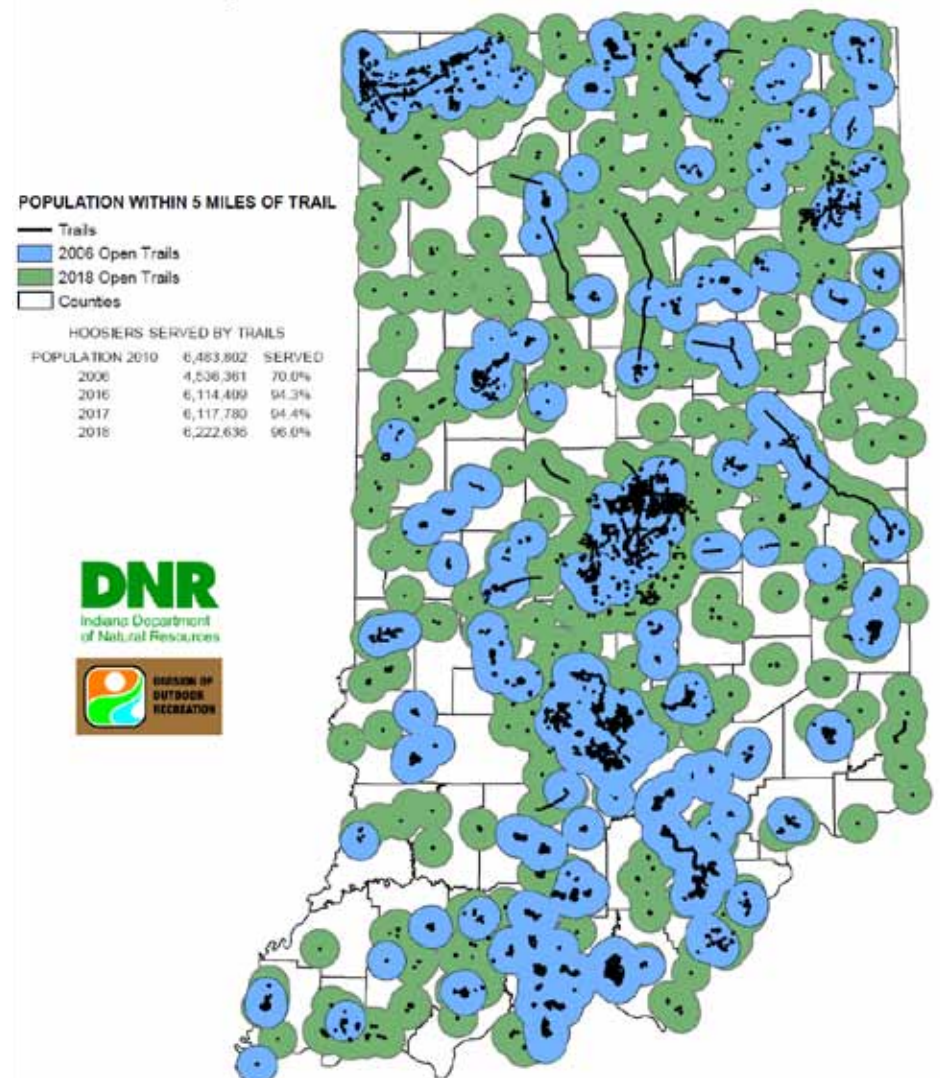
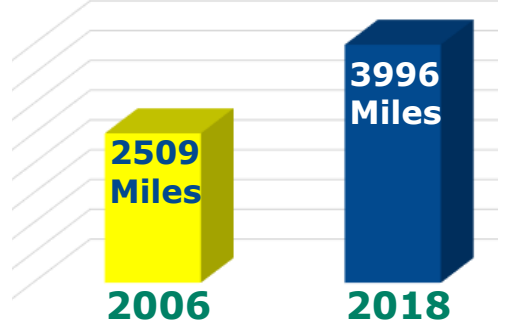

The Greenways Foundation is a charitable trust working to promote the growth, enhancement and use of Indiana greenways. To accomplish that, we solicit donations and make grants in support of greenway development, enhancement and operation.

- Assisting in forming effective local trails organizations
 - Building initial community support for trails
 - Providing startup grants to help local trails organizations build capacity and support
 - Acting as a source of trails information and consultation to local Indiana governments
 - Promoting best practices in the planning, marketing, design, development, and management of linear parks

We promote all types of trails, whether they are for bikers, walkers, horseback riders, ATVs or paddling canoes and kayaks down the waterways. We are proud of the many partners and friends we have made along the way!

The Greenways Foundation, Inc. is an Indiana nonprofit corporation, classified as a 501(c)(3) public charitable trust under IRS regulations. This means that contributions can be charitable tax deductions to qualified individuals who itemize deductions on their federal income tax return.

2019 Highlights

The Greenways Foundation presented our **2020 Legislative Platform** with the help of Indiana trail stakeholders. We continue to work with state legislators on funding the existing trails maintenance fund, and sustainable funding for new trails when the Next Level Trails program is complete. The demand for trails in Indiana is strong!



In October and November, the Foundation partnered with the Indiana Parks & Recreation Association (IPRA) to conduct six Trail Town Workshops throughout the state. In all, over 200 participants in Carmel, Evansville, Fort Wayne, Portage, South Bend and Terre Haute learned about this emerging national program, and strategies to promote trails in their communities. The Greenways Foundation plans to work with the IPRA and other agencies to promote Trail Towns as a designated program in Indiana during 2020.

Our **state license plate** accounts for our main source of revenue. At the end of 2019 there were **1620 plates** sold for a total income of **\$40,500**. Those who buy plates become new members of the Foundation.



Thanks to our state plates, we were able to **award \$30,477 in grants** to four organizations in 2019!

\$5,000 to Syracuse-Wawasee Trails to aid with the construction of the Conklin Bay Boardwalk & Trail



\$11,613 for two grants to the Midwest Equine Trail Foundation for equipment purchases

\$10,000 to Fort Wayne Trails to aid with the construction of the Golden Spike Trail

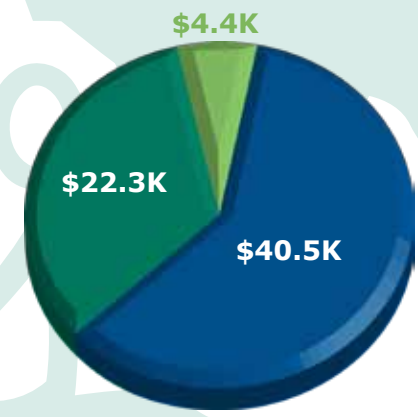


\$3,865 to the Friends of the Pumpkinvine Nature Trail to aid with the purchasing of trail counters

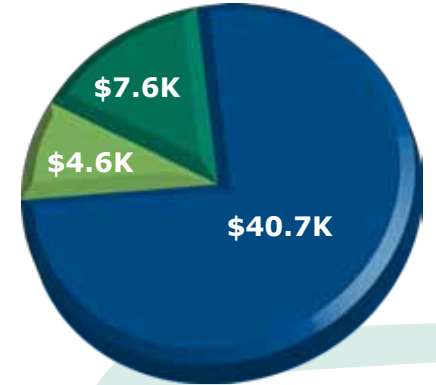
2019 Inflows \$67.2K

Donations 7%



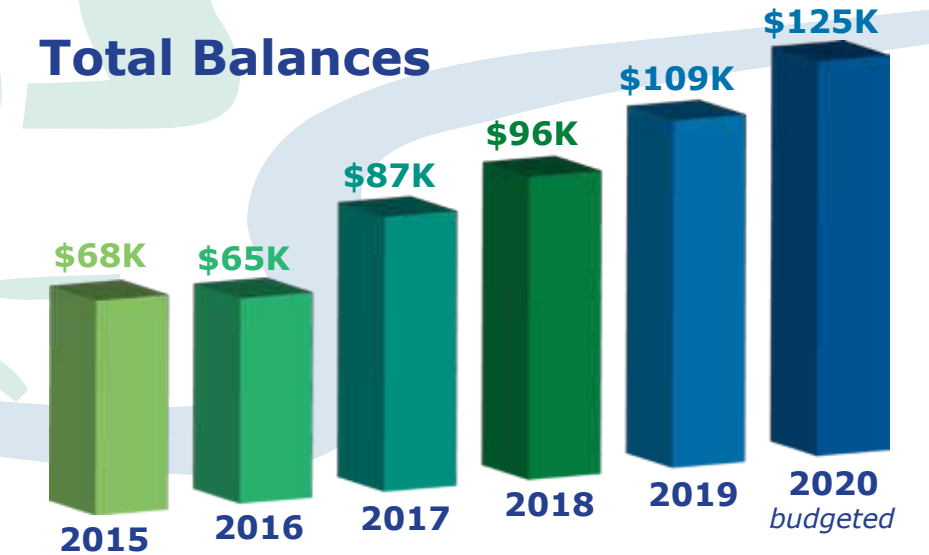
2019 Outflows \$52.9K
